2. Encourage healthy lifestyles and reduce risks to health and well being	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Educate people about sexual health and tackle the under 18 conception rate Take steps to halt the rise in obesity by promoting sport and active recreation Recognise and help to improve mental health Reduce the harm caused by illegal drugs
